
Red Ribbon/Youth Red Cross /Blood Donors Club

To the extent possible, we fulfill the demand for blood from the Medical College Hospital. This service done by our students also fits in with the vision of the college to serve the poorest of the poor for much of the recipients of blood from the Medical College Hospital are patients from the poorest sections of our society.

On December 12th 2017 we had the voluntary blood donation camp in our college. 176 units of blood were collected on that day. In addition our students regularly donate blood as and when needed to the Medical College Hospital. Our students serve as ambassadors of good will of our college in this regard.




ACADEMIC YEAR 2014-2015
